Taizé meditation was created by Brother Roger Schutz in 1940 for all Christian traditions (both Protestant & Catholic). This was during World War 2 and he was working for World Peace and to reconcile the Heart of the World.

He rode a bicycle from Geneva, Switzerland to Taizé, The town was in unoccupied France, just beyond the demarcation line with the zone occupied by German troops. He bought an empty house, where for two years he and his sister, Genevieve, hid refugees, both Christian and Jewish.

In the spirit of Brother Rodger, the TOS and the Liberal Catholic Church offer Taize Meditation each Friday leading up to Christmas. You are most welcome.



<u>December movie fund raiser</u> <u>RED DOG:</u> **TRUE BLUE**

The sequel begins with a wait-a-sec-what's-happening-here - as harried businessman, Michael Carter (Jason Isaacs), takes his two young sons to the movies...to see Red Dog! After the screening, Michael reveals to his young son that he was actually the first owner of the pooch that would eventually become famous for uniting the disparate residents of a WA mining town. The film then unfolds in flashback, as we meet young Michael (Levi Miller), who is shipped off to the remote farm of his grandfather (Bryan Brown in a wonderfully taciturn but deeply sensitive turn) when his father dies and his mother suffers a nervous breakdown. There, he learns about Aboriginal customs and land rights through indigenous farm-hand, Taylor Pete (Calen Tassone); romance through his comely tutor, Betty (Hanna Mangan Lawrence); and the rigours of male competitiveness through macho helicopter pilot, Stemple (Thomas Cocquerel). But mainly, Michael learns about the joys of companionship that a canine like Red Dog (originally called Blue) can bring.

With its pre-adolescent hero and near plotless coming of age narrative, Red Dog: True Blue instantly announces itself as a more distinctly family friendly affair than its predecessor, but it's still loose and freewheeling in the best way possible, jumping from plot point to plot point at will. In any other film, such narrative playfulness would feel odd, but here, it just adds to the film's colourful individuality. Coupled with a hard-edged sweetness and lots of humour, it makes for a winning mix. A classic boy-and-his-dog tale, Red Dog: True Blue has a big heart and bundles of



TOS - January movie fund raiser **A UNITED KINGDOM**

In the hands of a lesser director than the hugely talented Amma Asante, "A United Kingdom" might have been nothing more than another inter-racial romance cloaked in a veil of sickly sentimentality but, this remarkable film works both as a genuinely moving love story and, more significantly, as a powerful political tract that draws attention to a very shameful period in recent British history.



It is the story of Seretse Khama, heir to the throne of Bechuanaland, now Botswana. As a student in London, he fell in love with Ruth Williams, English and white. He brings her back to his homeland as his queen, much to the chagrin and disapproval of both the British and South African governments and his own people. However, like all good love stories, Ruth's tenacity soon wins over the people of Bechuanaland while the jaundiced, racist government of the UK proves a somewhat greater obstacle.

The events portrayed in the film actually took place but until now haven't been discussed. Even today inter-racial love stories can be unpopular and sadly racism remains a major issue that has yet to be eradicated. It is testament to both Seretse and to Ruth that their

actions were finally instrumental in bringing democracy to Botswana. In these roles both David Oyelowo and Rosamund Pike are superb and there is sterling work from an outstanding supporting cast. It is still heartening to see a movie about love and about race that is largely unsentimental and politically astute. It is also gorgeously shot by Sam McCurdy and is a credit to all involved.
